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Why is reading important?

- The 'reading age' of the GCSE papers is 15 Years and 7 months
- Reading skills are actually more important for maths and science than subjects like history and English
- "Young people who leave school without good literacy skills are held back at every stage of life. The outcomes are poorer on almost every measure, from health and wellbeing, to employment and finance." (Education Endowment Foundation, 2018)


































 If children are reading and understanding on a daily basis for 19 to 24 minutes a day there's substantial growth in their reading age and skills



 If they are reading and understanding for less than 3 minutes a day, they regress.





Talk about reading

- What made you choose this book?
- 'What has happened so far?'
- 'Can you give me a 1 minute summary?'
- 'What might happen next?'

Link into the child's own experience by asking questions like...

- 'Has this ever happened to you...tell me about it?'
- 'Have you ever been to a place like this... what was it like?'
- 'Have you ever done anything like that... what happened?'
- 'How do you think the character is feeling... have you ever felt like that?'

Acknowledge reading can be hard!







- Talk about reading Context clues
 - 'That's a tricky word, what does it mean?
 - 'You said 'meritorious' which sounds like 'merit' can you work out the meaning from that?
 - 'Can you think of a similar word to that?'
 - 'Can you think of an opposite word to that?'
 - 'How would you use that word in your own words?'
 - 'Let's look up the meaning together'




