## **Business Studies** overview

### **Exam Paper Structure**

- 105 minutes long (1 hour 45 minutes)
- Everything you've studied in Year 10 could be tested
- There are three sections:
  - **Section 1**: 6 multiple choice questions followed by 7 questions worth 2-marks each (20 marks in total)
  - Section 2: A case study followed by a series of questions including two or three 9-mark questions
  - **Section 3**: Same structure as section 2 but with a different case study

### How to revise effectively:

**Knowledge and understanding**: use flash cards to test your understanding of key terms. Watch videos by 'TwoTeachers', 'EconBizSesh', or 'Tutor2U' on YouTube.

**Evaluation**: practise giving your opinion and explaining why you it is your opinion.

Remember that you get marks for demonstrating the following skills:

**Analysis**: can you explain the causes or consequences of a specific issue?

**Evaluation**: can give a recommendation and justify it using evidence?

- A variety of questions ranging from 1 mark questions, through to 8 mark questions.
- Questions will ask you to identify, explain, evaluate or describe.
- Questions will cover all learning outcomes covered so far – specifically Learning Outcomes 1 and 2.

### What are the key points to take away?

Due to the variety of questions you need to make sure that you are confident with the different command words used and the requirements based on the marks attached to each question.

### The best revision materials to use for your Child Development exam

- Create a key terms glossary and practice defining key terms.
- Ensure that you go over strengths and weaknesses of different topic areas where relevant – e.g. methods of contraception. Tables or mind maps are useful here.
- Lots of the marks come from being able to fully expand your definitions/descriptions - make sure you revise what, why, how for any procedures or forms of medication.







- 7 questions
- Questions 1-6 = Analytical and Comparative questions, testing key terminology and Musical dictation (72 marks)
- Question 7 = Analysis question on Africa Toto (12 marks)

Your revision will need to be based on practice that you have done in relation to your listening and appraising. Please make sure that you use the resources on SharePoint that I have shown you for all the areas of study and for Africa.

- Includes multiple choice, short answer, longer answers and one 9 marker 'evaluate' question.
- The content of the 9 marker can only come from the Topic 3 – Physical Training.
- A mixture of command words including; identify, state, describe, explain, justify and evaluate.



### **Exam tips rom your RS teachers:**

- 1. Don't leave all 12 mark questions until the end.
- 2. Remember what you have learnt / what you know.
- **3. Show off** with key words, quotes, knowledge.
- 4. You are all VERY capable and you have very good knowledge!
- 5. If you don't know a word in the question write something that could be related / linked e.g. if Ashura comes up as a 12 mark question and you can't remember, compare to other festivals etc.
- 6. READ the question carefully don't risk losing marks (**BUG the question!**)
- 7. If you have time to plan 12 markers, then do.
- 8. Just write something **NEVER leave it blank**.
- Just breathe and take a minute if you get anxious / worried / forget things, you can go back to the questions.
- 10. Re-read all your answers to ensure you have maximised the marks you will achieve.


